will be entitled on production of their Through Tickets to the free use of the Conveyance.

BICYCLES, PERAMBULATORS, AND MAIL CARTS WILL NOT BE CONVEYED UNDER THIS ARRANGEMENT.

LUGGAGE

should be fully addressed, and labelled at the Starting Station through to destination; but on
arrival at Liverpool (Exchange Station) Passengers must claim their Luggage and point
it out to the Company's Porters, who will convey it on board the Steamers free of charge.

On the Return Journey the Luggage must, on arrival of the Steamer at Liverpool,
be pointed out to the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company's Porters, who will take
charge of it, and arrange for its free conveyance to the Exchange Station, Liverpool, where it
must be claimed.
